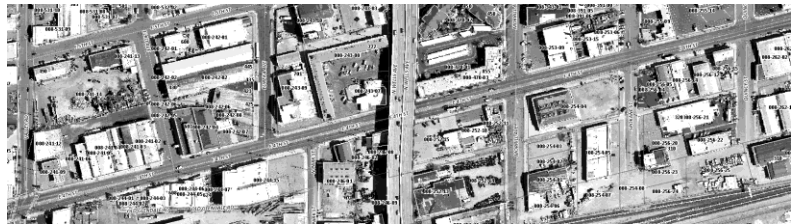

An emergency shelter for families located at Reno's Community Assistance Center.



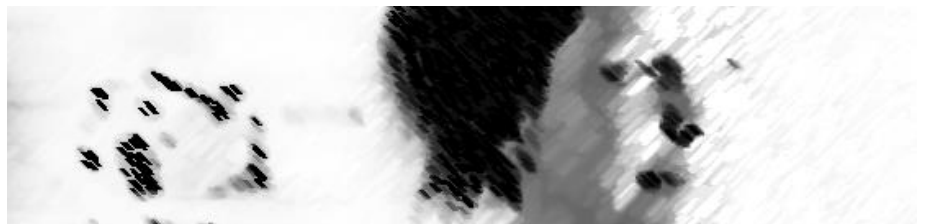
Affordable Housing for Seniors
